

Attention Medicare Advantage Patients:

Medicare FAQ's Regarding Changes in 2011

1. Do MANA physicians accept Medicare Advantage/Part C plans?

Most MANA physicians accept original Medicare but **do not accept Medicare Advantage/Part C plans.**

2. Will the healthcare reform changes affect care with my MANA physician?

Starting January 1, 2011, all Medicare Advantage plans must have a provider network in place. If you have a Medicare Advantage plan, you will no longer have a choice to see any provider you want with the same benefits you had in the past. With the Advantage plans, you will need to seek services from a provider who is listed in-network under your plan.

The following MANA physicians will be considered out-of-network for ALL Medicare Advantage/Part C plans:

- Family Practice / FirstCare Family Doctors
- Internal Medicine / Fayetteville Diagnostic Clinic
- Rheumatology / FDC
- Gynecology / Renaissance Women's Healthcare
- Neurology / FDC

The following specialists are in-network with some plans like Humana Medicare Advantage, Medipak Advantage. Please check with your insurance if you have another Medicare Advantage plan.

- MANA Pulmonary Medicine / FDC
- MANA Nephrology
- Radiology / MANA Imaging
- Allergy / FDC
- MANA Gastroenterology / FDC

*** If you choose a Medicare Advantage plan instead of the original Medicare, please check with your plan before seeking services to see if your provider is in your network and will be covered after January 1, 2011.**
